

UNDER 18 INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN CONSENT FORM

Congratulations on receiving your Murdoch University offer letter

If you are an international student under 18 years old, you must have approved accommodation and welfare arrangements in place before you can accept your offer to study at Murdoch University. This is a requirement set by the Australian Government.

Your student visa will only be granted if these arrangements are confirmed and approved. They must stay in place until you either turn 18 or your visa ends, whichever comes first. **Failure to comply may result in exclusion from Murdoch University and cancellation of your student visa.**

International students who are under 18 at time of acceptance are required to provide details of parent or legal guardian, regardless of the welfare arrangement option chosen. Your parent or legal guardian/custodian must provide consent before you can accept your offer. This form must be completed and returned to Murdoch International Admissions directly (if you are a direct applicant) or via your Murdoch University pathway provider (if you are a pathway student).

By completing this form, the parent or legal guardian/custodian agrees to the conditions in the student's Letter of Offer and confirm the accommodation and welfare arrangements in place for your child.

A legal guardian/custodian is defined as person(s) with parental responsibility (anyone who can lawfully determine where the child/children is/are to live).

If one parent, or legal guardian/custodian, has lawfully been made solely responsible for making decisions as to where the child/ children is/are to live, then only that parent or person needs to sign the consent form and provide the required documentation.

ACCOMMODATION AND WELFARE ARRANGEMENTS

As an international student under the age of 18 you **must choose one of two** approved living arrangements while studying at Murdoch University:

- **A.** Live in a Murdoch University's approved accommodation provider <u>Australian Homestay Network</u> (**AHN**) or <u>Murdoch University Campus Living Village</u> (**CLV**) in conjunction with the approved Welfare provider <u>ISA</u> Student Advocates.
- **B.** Live with a parent or close relative (nominated by your parent or legal quardian/custodian)

Tick one of the options below:

□ **Option A:** Student stays in an accommodation and welfare arrangement approved by Murdoch University. I have chosen Option A and will provide Murdoch University with confirmation of accommodation and welfare arrangements for approval.

Note: With this option, Murdoch University is responsible for your welfare unless your parent officially appoints someone else as your legal guardian.

If you cannot live with a parent or a close relative while you are under the age of 18, Murdoch University will help arrange appropriate accommodation, support and welfare arrangements for you.



Murdoch University will issue a Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare (**CAAW**) letter, which is needed for your visa. The dates when the accommodation arrangement and welfare arrangements commence will be stated on your CAAW letter. You must not travel to Australia before your welfare arrangements commence, and you must agree to stay on the arranged accommodation until you turn 18 or until your visa expires.

Murdoch University's preferred accommodation provider is the Australian Homestay Network (**AHN**) or Murdoch

Murdoch University's preferred accommodation provider is the Australian Homestay Network (**AHN**) or Murdoch University Campus Living Village (**CLV**) in conjunction with the provider of Welfare arrangements, ISA Student Advocates.

To apply for these arrangements, you can either contact AHN or CLV in conjunction with ISA Student Advocates directly or via your education agent (if applicable).

You will receive a confirmation after you have successfully applied for accommodation, please forward this information to Murdoch International Admissions directly (if you are a direct applicant) or via your Murdoch University pathway provider (if you are a pathway student).

□ <u>Option B:</u> Student stays in an accommodation and welfare arrangement approved by the Department of Home Affairs. I have chosen Option B and my child will live in Perth, WA with me or a Department of Home Affairs approved close relative until they turn 18.

You can live with your parent or a close relative (like a grandparent, aunt, uncle, or sibling) while you are in Australia. Please note that cousins, distant aunts and uncles will not be accepted as close relatives by the Department of Home Affairs. Your parent must officially nominate this person using the appropriate form when applying for your visa.

To qualify:

- The relative must be over 21 years old.
- They must be allowed to stay in Australia until you turn 18 or your visa ends.
- They must provide a police clearance to show they are of good character.

If your parent or close relative is not already in Australia, they can apply for a visa to come with you.

The Department of Home Affairs will assess and approve this arrangement, not Murdoch University.

ACCEPTING YOUR OFFER & CONFIRMING YOUR UNDER 18 WELFARE ARRANGEMENTS

Before you can apply for your student visa, you need to complete the following important steps:

- 1. Complete and sign the Murdoch University Under 18 Arrangement Form. This form confirms your accommodation and welfare arrangements. You must submit it along with your acceptance of offer form.
- 2. If your parent(s) wish to appoint a guardian, they must also complete the "Appointing a Guardian" form.
- 3. Once Murdoch University receives all the required documents, you will be issued:
 - a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)
 - a Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare (CAAW) letter (if you've chosen Option A)
- 4. With your CoE and CAAW letter, you can then apply for your student visa. For help with your visa application, visit the Department of Home Affairs website.

If you want to change your living or welfare arrangements (for example, switching from an approved accommodation provider to living with a close relative), you **must** first speak with Murdoch University. If needed, Murdoch will help you notify the Department of Home Affairs. You must always have approved welfare arrangements in place until you turn 18 or your visa ends, whichever comes first.



YOUR NEXT STEPS

To get ready for your visa and studies at Murdoch University, follow these steps:

- Step 1: Pick one of the two accommodation options (option A or option B).
- Step 2: Fill in the Murdoch University Under 18 Welfare and Accommodation Arrangements (this form).

Both you and your parent or legal guardian/custodian must sign it.

- **Step 3 (optional)**: If your parents want to officially appoint a guardian (for option B), they must also complete the Form 157N Nomination of a student custodian to your application.
- **Step 4:** Submit all completed forms along with your Acceptance of Offer form as explained in your offer letter.
- Step 5: Once everything is approved, Murdoch University will send you a CoE and CAAW letter (if required).
- **Step 6:** Use your CoE and CAAW to apply for your student visa. Visit the Department of Home Affairs website for more information.

If you are an international student under 18, you must choose one of the two approved care options listed in this agreement.

What to do:

- Complete and sign this agreement.
- Submit it along with your signed Offer Acceptance Form.
- Email both documents to <u>Murdoch International Admissions</u> directly (if you are a direct applicant) or via your <u>Murdoch University pathway provider</u> (if you are a pathway student).

Once Murdoch University receives your completed paperwork, we will issue your CoE and CAAW letter (if required). These documents are essential for your student visa application.

Section 5: Declaration.

I understand and agree to the following:

- The welfare and accommodation arrangements approved on this document are until the student turns 18 years of age and cannot be changed without prior consent from Murdoch University.
- Any alteration to the arrangements will require a new approval process, which includes the new
 documentation to be signed by the parent/guardian.
- Murdoch University will only consider the changes to the agreed Welfare and Accommodation Agreement for the following reasons:
 - Failure on the part of the caregiver or accommodation provider to deliver the appropriate services to the student. This will be determined by Murdoch University
 - A parent who arrives in Perth on a guardianship visa in order to resume the students care arrangements.
- Murdoch University reserves the right to require changes to the care or accommodation arrangements due to the following circumstances:
 - The caregiver or accommodation provider fails to give the appropriate services stipulated to the student.
 - Any form of dishonest or inappropriate behaviour by the caregiver or the accommodation provider
- If the student does not follow the agreed arrangements, Murdoch University may cancel student's CAAW letter. This could lead to Student's visa being cancelled.
- Student must contact Murdoch University 14 days before commencing to confirm their arrival before
 Orientation week to arrange a meeting.
- Parent(s)/custodian(s) to accept offer letter on student's behalf.

Privacy notice

Murdoch University collects the information on this form to meet Australian Government requirements for international students under 18 years of age. These requirements are set out in the ESOS Act 2000 and are part of the student visa regulations.

We use this information to confirm your accommodation and welfare arrangements. If you do not provide it, we may not be able to issue the documents you need to apply for your student visa, and your visa may not be granted.

Your personal information will be handled in accordance with Murdoch University's Privacy Policy, which outlines:

- How your information is used and stored
- When it may be shared (e.g. for legal reasons or safety concerns)
- How you can access or correct your personal information
- How to make a complaint if you believe your privacy has been breached
